SPOTLIGHT ON ATTENDANCE

School Values: Passionate about Learning and Make a Difference



The attendance for our School is very positive and the vast majority of our children have very high levels of attendance. However, the School has received a number of requests for absence for family holidays in term time.



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Therefore, we would like to outline the school policy on term time absence and the impact of absence on learning and social development.

Holidays in term time are not acceptable reasons to be absent. The School cannot authorise a term time holiday. This includes being absent either side of a half term holiday even for one or two days. Please consult the term dates on the website and plan holidays using the 175 non-school days a year: <u>Term Dates</u>

Requesting to leave the school early to travel is not an acceptable reason to be absent from school. Please organise family travel outside of school time using the non-school days a year.

Requesting time out of the school day for a non-urgent appointment is not an acceptable reason to be absent from school. Routine appointments such as visiting the opticians or dentist should be made in the non-school days a year.

Music and dance exams should be made for non-school days if at all possible.

Absence in term time will only be authorised in truly exceptional circumstances. The school's Attendance Policy can be found on our website and provides more information which can be accessed here: <u>School's Attendance</u> <u>Policy</u>

The Department of Education deems persistent absence as 90%. If attendance falls below 90% a pupil is considered and recorded as a **persistent absentee**. Parents of pupils with 90% attendance or below will be contacted to discuss the reasons for their child's low attendance.

The Department of Education deems severe absence as 50%. Although rare, if attendance falls below 50% a pupil is considered a **severe absentee**. Parents of pupils with 50% attendance or below will be contacted to discuss the reasons for their child's low attendance. A meeting will take place where an action plan will be agreed together in order to improve attendance.

What Research Says:

Research shows that children who take time out of school:


- Experience a detrimental effect on their educational progress and attainment.
- Find it difficult to maintain friendships.
- Experience anxiety when returning to school due to missing lessons.
- Experience anxiety when returning to school due to changing friendships.

Over a five year period, a child whose attendance is at 90% will effectively miss half of a school year.
