The school day is as follows:

When the classroom doors open, children are allowed to enter their classrooms. There is a morning activity for the children to start at this time and this enables the children to settle into their classroom. This arrangement also eases playground and traffic congestion in the morning.

At the end of the day please can children and parents make their way to the exits by 3:45pm so that our site manager, Mr Brindley, can safeguard our site and lock the gates; other activities take place after school and the site must be secured; please note that children are not to linger on the fields after school.

#### PUNCTUALITY

Please ensure your child arrives at school before the morning bell. This facilitates a calm start to the day.























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## **ATTENDANCE**

We want our children to have excellent attendance and achieve well. We are not able to authorise holidays in term time; please refer to our term dates on this link before booking a holiday.

As part of our safeguarding procedures, if your child is too poorly to attend school, please notify the school office by phoning to report the reason for absence.

Please note that all routine medical appointments should be made outside of the school day if possible, for example visiting the dentist or optician.

## **REDUCING CONGESTION - PARK AND STRIDE**

Many of our parents take advantage of the large Tesco carpark. Parents can park for free whilst they drop their child off at school; walking to school helps children learn pedestrian skills so that when they begin to walk on their own they are better equipped to deal with traffic. It introduces them to an important and easy form of exercise. It helps to reduce traffic and air pollution and helps to improve our local environment. It strengthens communities by getting people, parents and children in particular, to work together as a team. The journey to school gives children a chance to talk and make new friends so that when they've arrived at school they're ready to learn. In order to alleviate congestion, please park away from school and do not try to park on Orchard or Osbourne Road; please also note that the car park at the bottom of Orchard Road is a staff carpark only and parents should not use it as a thoroughfare.

#### SCHOOL GATES

As a reminder, parents can now enter school through any school gate. We have gates on Orchard and Osborne Road, Balmoral Road and Stockport Road at the end of the ginnel next to the golf course; please note that we do not permit dogs on site apart from assistance dogs.

#### SCHOOL MEAL PAYMENTS

We serve delicious meals prepared and cooked on site. The menus can be found on our website. Infant meals are funded through the government initiative Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM). Please note that payments must be made **prior** to each half term. Parents also have the option of paying in full for the whole year if they wish.

#### **HEALTHY EATING SNACKS**

Reception and infant children receive a government funded piece of fruit each day. Children in the junior department are encouraged to bring a piece of fruit to school for their mid-morning snack.

We have noticed that some parents ask to give out treats to their child's class on their birthday. Over the year this can add up to lots of sweets and is not in keeping with our healthy eating approach. We also have a number of children with allergies or dietary requirements. For this reason, and in line with many other schools, we would like to ask parents not to bring in sweets for birthdays. This is also in line with our school nursery policy.

# **NUT FREE SCHOOL**

Several of our children have nut allergies. For this reason, we ask that children do not bring in products containing nuts or have traces of nuts for their snack or for their packed lunch.

We aim to be a listening school and offer an open door to parents. Mrs Farrell (deputy head teacher based in the junior department), Mrs Tiernan (deputy head teacher based in the infant department), and I are very happy to answer any questions you may have.
