HEADTEACHER'S NEWSLETTER

COVID SAFETY

You will know that Trafford's number of Covid infections is very high. As a result of this, Trafford Public Health have needed to ask educational settings to put in place enhanced Covid safety measures. The Public Health letter sent to parents last week supersedes previous advice. In line with the Trafford infection rate and local schools, we are seeing increased numbers of Covid cases in school. We ask parents to support us in ensuring children are tested if they have symptoms. We hope that those with Covid recover well and are back in school soon.

We continue to be in a fast moving situation where information and guidance can change with little notice. Thank you for your support in following the guidance. This is where we see our St Vincent community at it's best by all playing our part in the recovery of the pandemic.

FACE COVERINGS

All staff (unless exempt) must wear face coverings in all indoor communal areas. (Corridors, Library, staffrooms). Face coverings in classrooms are not essential, but we respect staff who want to wear one. Pupils are not asked to wear face coverings. Parents are asked to wear face coverings whilst on site.

VENTILATION

Wherever possible all windows and doors are to be open.

LATERAL FLOW DEVICE TESTING

Staff continue to carry out lateral flow tests twice a week.

PUPIL HAND AND RESPIRATORY HYGIENE

Personal hand sanitiser is recommended along with tissues for sneezing/coughing.

























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ENHANCED CLEANING

We will continue with enhanced cleaning of regularly touched surfaces.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR

Extra-curricular activities can continue. We are very keen to support our extra-curricular provision and the associated wellbeing benefits it gives to our pupils.

NEW HOUSEHOLD CONTACT GUIDANCE (STAFF AND STUDENTS)

Trafford have now revised the guidance for those students who live in a household with someone who has tested positive for Covid-19, and have issued the following advice:

LFD TESTING FOR HOUSEHOLD CONTACTS

Since August, adults who are double vaccinated and children do not need to self-isolate if they live with someone who has Covid.

We are asking all students and staff members who live with someone who has Covid to do daily lateral flow tests (LFD test) before coming into school – unless exempt (see exemptions below). Pupils should start this testing from the day their household member either became unwell with Covid or tested positive if they did not have symptoms and continue this for 10 days.

- Please remember;
- if your child tests negative, they can continue attending school.
- if your child has a positive LFD result, they must start isolating, have a PCR test and inform school.
- if they develop Covid symptoms, they should book a PCR test. It is important that people with Covid symptoms do not rely on a negative LFD test and they should have a PCR test. If your child develops symptoms of Covid they must not come to school and should remain at home.

Exemptions to household testing

The groups exempt from this advice are:

- Children 5 and under
- Children in Key Stage 1
- SEND schools



























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- 12–18-year-olds who have had at least one dose of the vaccine more than 14 days ago
- Any child, aged between 5 16, who has tested positive for COVID-19 via a PCR test within the past 90 days (unless **new** symptoms develop).

POSITIVE CASES IN SCHOOL

If your child is a contact of a case in school, please book them in to take a PCR test as soon as possible (unless they have had a positive PCR test in the last 90 days). Children aged 4 and under who are identified as a contact will not be advised to take a PCR test unless the positive case was someone in their own household.

If your child develops symptoms of Covid, they must not come to school and should remain at home. They must get a PCR test as soon as possible and isolate until the result is available. People who get a positive PCR test must continue to isolate as usual.

Thank you for all of the donations sent in this week. We have been overwhelmed with the generosity of parents. The donations were dropped off to South Trafford Foodbank and Cornerstone Day Centre for the homeless this afternoon. Thanks also to the parents who delivered the donations off today.
