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HELP FOR HOUSEHOLDS



Please find some information supporting families with the cost of living.

Trafford Assist is the Council's local welfare assistance scheme to help residents in short-term acute financial difficulties. You can get emergency help with food, energy and water bills, essential travel expenses, white goods and furniture.

Households on certain low-income benefits, like Universal Credit, Income Support. Tax Credits and Pension Credit, will receive a £650 cost of living payment. This will be paid automatically in two instalments.

All domestic households will receive a £400 energy rebate through the Energy Bills Support Scheme - your energy supplier will apply this discount to your energy bills for you from October 2022.

Trafford households in Council Tax bands A-D also received a £150 Council Tax energy rebate in April 2022.

Other sources of help:

Get help with money matters - this page has information on getting help with debts, making the most of your money, where to get benefits advice and help with energy bills.

Find support with food - food banks and community grocery schemes, plus help available from supermarkets and Free School Meals.

Get help with school uniform costs - including grants to pay for new items of school uniform, or places offering preloved clothes, shoes and kit.

HAVE YOUR CIRCUMSTANCES CHANGED?

All pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are offered a free and healthy school lunch, known as Universal Free School Meals (UFSM) whether they are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) or not. Even if your child receives UFSM, it is still important for the school to know whether eligibility exists for FSM as this may lead to additional school funding. Children in school years 3 to 6 will be offered a free lunch if they meet certain criteria for FSM.

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals; your child is eligible for free school meals if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance

























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- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- The guaranteed part of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as your annual gross income is £16,190 or less and you don't get Working Tax Credit)
- Working Tax Credit run-off after you come off Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit that you applied for on, or after, 1 April 2018 (as long as your household income is less than £7,400 a year after tax, not including any benefits)

Registering for Free School Meals could also raise an extra £1,320 in Pupil Premium for your child's school to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after school activities. This additional money is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the benefits listed above. Please contact the school office in confidence if you believe you may be eligible.
