Art and Design Curriculum Overview

Art and Design at St Vincent's

At St Vincent's we provide children with a rich and varied curriculum based on the four core elements of art and design:

- Drawing
- Paint and mixed media
- Craft and design
- Sculpture and 3D

St Vincent's have chosen to follow a scheme called Kapow as it is a spiral scheme, allowing for revisiting of key concepts and building of knowledge throughout the key stages. Art is taught in alternating half terms to DT, ensuring full curriculum coverage and development of key skills.

At St Vincent's, we offer opportunities for children to enrich their learning in after school clubs. We currently offer Tactile Arts clubs throughout the year.

These are the topics being taught this half term in art and design:

EYFS	Drawing: Marvellous Marks
Year 1	Painting and mixed media: Colour Splash
Year 2	Craft and design: Map It Out
Year 3	Drawing: Growing Artists
Year 4	Painting and mixed media: Light and Dark
Year 5	Drawing: I Need Space
Year 6	Drawing: Make My Voice Heard

Skills we have learnt so far this year ...

In EYFS, the children explored and investigated primary colours within the continuous provision using paint, chalk and other media

In Key Stage 1, the children focused on the 'formal elements of art'. In Year 1 they explored shape, line and colour and in Year 2 the focus was pattern, tone and texture.

In Key Stage 2, Year 4 and 5 continued to build upon their knowledge of the 'formal elements of art', by further exploring pattern and texture and discovering art through architecture.

Year 3 linked their art topic with learning about the Stone Age and pre-historic art where they were inspired by cave painting.

Year 6 spent time developing their skills in design, drawing, printing, painting and art appreciation.
