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

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Reading Curriculum Overview









Make a Difference - We read to learn about our place in the wider world, develop morally and spiritually and to grow as people, ready to make a difference to the world around us.

Reading at St Vincent's

The aim of our reading curriculum is to:

Equip children with the skills to become confident, fluent and engaged readers.

Enable children to become familiar with a wide range of texts, genres, authors.

Children learn to read so that they can read to learn and access the wider curriculum and apply these skills to the wider world.

At St Vincent's, we believe that all our children can become fluent readers and writers. This is why we teach early reading through Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised, which is a systematic and synthetic phonics programme. We start teaching phonics in Reception with the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised progression, which ensures children build on their growing knowledge of the alphabetic code, mastering phonics to read and spell as they move through school.

Comprehension

At our school, we value reading as a crucial life skill. By the time children leave us, they read confidently for meaning and regularly enjoy reading for pleasure. Our readers are equipped with the tools to tackle unfamiliar vocabulary. We encourage our children to see themselves as readers for both pleasure and purpose. From EYFS to Year 6 the children are taught the following key strategies to use as 'a toolkit' to support their reading and comprehension of a text. These strategies include; activating prior knowledge, selfcorrecting, clarifying, predicting, vocabulary, retelling, summarising, inferring, text analysis, questioning, interpretive strategies and visualisation.



Reading for Pleasure

"It is impossible to mandate that pupils read for pleasure, but teachers can inspire pupils and engage them in reading widely. This depends, however, on embedding a school_culture that values and supports reading for pleasure. (The Reading Framework July 2023)

We value reading for pleasure highly and work hard as a school to grow our Reading for Pleasure pedagogy.
